More needs to be done with regards to developing speech for children with aids and start back with activities like swimming and mixing with hearing children.

We agree! As a sign bilingual school we strive to provide excellence in both English and BSL. We work closely with our speech and language therapists on spoken language and share pupils' targets with parents regularly. We also collaborate with our clinical audiologist to optimise children's use of their hearing technologies. Pupils who benefit from radio aids are provided with them in class. We work hard to develop children's independence in managing their own devices and we track this using their audiology profiles. We promote spoken language equally alongside the use of BSL. Children enjoy singing and music as part of our curriculum. They are encouraged to take part in such activities as it is a fun way to develop their speech.

Moving on, we are equally frustrated that we have had to pause our whole school swimming lessons, which has been a feature of our sports provision for many years, because of Covid. We know that parents will understand our primary aim to safeguarding children and so whilst we are in the grip of this pandemic, we took the decision to pause whole school swimming lessons. We are hoping to reinstate lessons for KS2 in the Summer term of 2022 (if we are able to do so). We are thrilled that we have been able to reinstate inclusion opportunities, with our two local primary schools in the autumn term, despite Covid. However, we will monitor this situation carefully and follow Covid guidance at all time regarding these visits.

We think that it is incredibly important that parents know all about their children's school day and learning experiences. That is why we have a range of ways we get in touch with you. Teachers send home information on a daily basis (Home School Books). Often, there will be photographs included in these messages as well. These are great as it means they can be easily shared with your child. Every half term, staff send home a 'What's On' newsletter. We send this in their school bags, but also email it to you and they are available on the school website. The children then share their learning highlights in their 'What's Happening' newsletter. Our school website holds a wealth of information too.
