






Headteacher's Message...

We have been awarded the British Council's prestigious International School Award in recognition of its work to bring the world into the classroom.

The International School Award celebrates the achievements of schools that do exceptional work in international education. The whole school learnt about the Commonwealth this year as the Commonwealth Games took place in Birmingham and took part in a Birmingham project, 'Your Love Lifts Me up', as well as learning about countries in the Commonwealth and sharing their learning with our partner school in Jamaica.

We are proud the school has been recognised for its achievements in this area and the impact it is having on our pupils. We have worked hard to imbed internationalism into our curriculum and ensure our pupils are global citizens and know they can make a difference in the world.
