To date the whole school attendance figure is **91.49%**.

Attendance is important because we know that attendance directly affects your child's progress and achievement! If you would like to discuss your child's attendance then please contact me directly.

Please remember to ring school every day that your child is absent from school to let us know the reason. Please do not simply give messages to your child's guide. Here is a chart which gives you an idea about what impact missing school can have on your child.

Attendance %	Equals days Absent in a year	Weeks absent in a year	Lessons missed
95%	9 days	2 weeks	50 lessons
90% Persistent Absenteeism	19 days	4 weeks	100 lessons
85% Persistent Absenteeism	29 days	6 weeks	150 lessons
80% Persistent Absenteeism	38 days	8 weeks	200 lessons
