BID Services will be running a summer holiday scheme on the following days:

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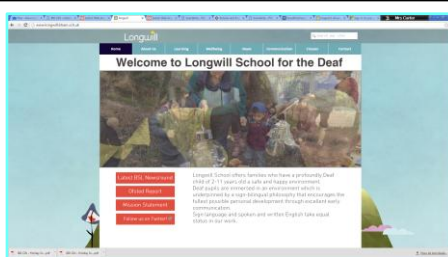

Attendance Awards for individual pupils will be handed out at our final assembly. As you know, it is very important for the children to attend school as much as they possibly can. Every Wednesday we have a special achievement assembly to celebrate which class has achieved the best attendance for that week. Pupils attendance has improved this year - 92.68 % (up 1.6% on the same period last year).

Thanks must go to pupils and parents for supporting us band encouraging the very best possible attendance! I understand that our children may have additional needs, which can sometimes 'get in the way' of excellent attendance, but I would ask you to try to organise as many appointments as you can outside school time. Also, if appointments can be made at the start or end of the day and then pupils can at least attend school for part of the day.

September starts with a busy few weeks. The first week involves settling in, making new friends and learning the classroom rules. This year, as part of our **Rights Respecting Charter**, classes will have the opportunity to create their own set of Class Rules.
